Why prayer?

Praying is a powerful way the Lord draws near to us and reorients our hearts to see Him at work in our lives. Even Jesus prayed (Matthew 26:41-44)! Pray personally in private and pray with your family. Some of the sweetest moments for our family is when we pray together. Even our daughter who is non-verbal takes a turn, and it's beautiful. Though we may only hear grunts, the Lord hears and knows her heart. Just like our typical children, she too will be blessed by the habit of seeking the Lord in prayer. Life can be so full, but try to remember that God designed us to need Him and wants us to seek Him in prayer constantly. He knows we can't do life on our own and offers Himself to us if we seek Him in prayer. Even if we are at a loss of what to pray, Romans 8:26-28 tells us that "the Holy Spirit intercedes for the saints, according to the will of God." What a sweet comfort!

ADDITIONAL RESOURCES



Activity: Create a Prayer Jar

Objective:

To create a family prayer activity using a jar filled with prayer prompts to encourage spiritual reflection and connection during mealtimes, morning devotions, or throughout the day.

Gather the family and explain the purpose of the prayer jar- to inspire meaningful prayers and foster growth in Christ together. Discuss how pulling a prompt at random can encourage our reliance on God.

Materials Needed:

- A clean, empty jar (mason jar, small container, or similar)
- Small pieces of paper (cut from index cards or scrap paper)
- Pens or markers
- Optional: Decorative materials (stickers, ribbon, labels) to personalize the jar

Create Prayer Prompts:

As a family, brainstorm prayer topics suitable for all ages. Write each prompt on a separate piece of paper. Aim for 20-30 prompts. Fold the papers and place them in the jar.

Ideas:

- Gratitude: "Thank God for something or someone."
- Intercession: "Pray for someone who is sick."
- Reflection: "Ask God for help with a challenge you're facing."
- Praise: "Praise God for one of His attributes (holy, merciful, gracious, kind, Creator)."
- Community: "Pray for a neighbor or friend."
- Personal Growth: "Ask God to help you show kindness today."

Decorate the Jar

Make it special!



Activity: Create a Prayer Jar

Use it:

- Decide when to use the prayer jar
 - Example: during breakfast, dinner, or morning devotions, etc.
- Keep the jar accessible for spontaneous use throughout the day.
- Have one family member draw a paper from the jar at the chosen time.
- Read the prompt aloud, and pray together.
- Encourage each family member to pray based on the prompt, either silently or aloud.
- For younger children, guide them with simple phrases or let them share a one-sentence prayer.
- Encourage spontaneity-remind everyone this is their prayer jar and they can use it anytime!

Discuss:

- After praying, briefly share thoughts or feelings about the prompt to deepen connection.
 - Example: "Why did you choose to pray for that neighbor?" or "How did it feel to thank God for something today?"

Reflect:

• Discuss how the prayer jar has influenced family time or personal faith. Ask questions like, "What's been your favorite prompt?" or "How has praying together helped us?"

Tips for Success:

- Keep prompts simple and age-appropriate to engage all family members.
- Rotate who draws the prompt to involve everyone.
- Refresh the prompts
 - Every 1-2 months, review the prompts as a family.
- Discard any that feel repetitive and add new ones based on current needs or events.
 - Example: "Pray for our community's safety" during a local event.
- Store the jar in a visible place to encourage regular use.
- Create a routine by doing this everyday!



Activity: Create a Prayer Journal

Objective:

To guide family members in creating personalized prayer journals and establishing a habit of making their requests known to God, and provide a way to reflect on God's faithfulness often, both personally and as a family.

Materials Needed:

- Notebooks or blank journals (one per person)
- Pens, pencils, colored pencils, watercolors or markers
- Stickers, decorative items (optional)
- A quiet, comfortable space for reflection

Purpose:

Set the tone and explain the value of a prayer journal. Gather the family in a cozy space. Personalize journals to make the activity meaningful and fun. Provide each family member with a notebook, blank journal or printed sheets. Encourage decorating the cover with drawings, stickers, or watercolors. Have them write their name on the cover.

Discuss:

- "Why do we pray? What is prayer to you?"
- "How does writing down our thoughts or prayers draw us closer to God?"
- "Why do you think making your journal special is important? Does it make you feel excited to use it?"
- Share a brief example: "A prayer journal is a special place to write your thoughts, prayers, and gratitude. It's like a conversation with God or a way to reflect your relationship with Him and reflect on His faithfulness over the years.



Activity: Create a Prayer Journal

Model the Process:

- Write a sample entry in your journal.
 - Example: "I'm thankful for my family. I pray for my friend who is sick. God, help me to see you at work today. Lord, help me to trust you more."
- Encourage everyone to write or draw their first entry. Younger children can draw pictures or dictate to an adult.

Prayer Journal Prompts:

- · What's one thing you're thankful for today?
- Who needs help right now, and how can you pray for them?
- What's something you're worried about?
- Is there anything you need to repent of?
- · What's one thing you hope for this week?
- How did you see God glorified today?

Share + Reflect:

- Build family connection by sharing and reflecting. Invite family members to share one part of their journal entry.
 - Example:
 - "How did it feel to write or draw in your journal? Did it help you think about anything special?"
 - "How have you seen God's faithfulness on display throughout this process?"

Tips for Success:

- Encourage creativity: Let kids use colors or stickers to make entries fun.
- Model consistency: Parents can share their own entries to inspire kids.
- Set a weekly family time to share journal highlights.
- Create a family prayer board where everyone adds a prayer request weekly.
